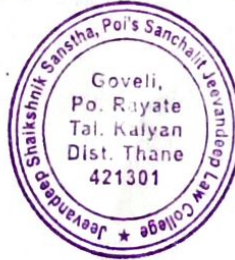

The analysis of the Feedback obtained is represented as under.

Students: Students (FYLLB) have shared a positive response and did not make any suggestions. The delivery of the syllabus, the depth of content, practical training all received good ratings from all the students.

It is evident that more than 65 percent of the students gave excellent response and more than 25 percent gave Good response to the syllabus.

Teachers: Teachers have responded positively too with 37.21 % excellent rating and 41.11 % very good rating and 18.7% good rating. Suggestions were put forth to increase the no of reference books.

Advocates: Advocates, being the integral part of Law fraternity were enthusiastic to know about the current syllabus and those who were already aware were keen on giving their feedback. 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Report - Action Taken on the Feedback

Analysis Academic Year 2019 -2020

The College gathered feedback from students (LL.B.), teachers and advocates.

Analysis of the data as enumerated in the analysis report has given insight as to where the current syllabus stands. The analysis gives direction as to what are the steps that the college, with the hard work of the teachers and the support of the students, can take up to enhance the syllabus and delivery of the same.

Based upon the analyzed data, the college dedicated to pursue the following initiatives in the upcoming academic year.

1. Concentrate on the core subjects like Constitution, Contract, Family Law, Jurisprudence, Civil Procedure, Criminal Procedure, Evidence etc. by employing teaching methods like role play, mock counseling sessions.
2. Various workshops were planned and undertaken on topics like Mediation and Counseling, Cyber laws, Labor Laws and human rights.
